



COVID-19 and the 2022 March for Life

Masks:

1. On our buses, masks are highly encouraged, but not required.
2. Participants are required to have a mask with them at all times so they can wear it if we enter a building or area that requires them.
3. Our pilgrimage will not enforce masking other than when we enter buildings, establishments, or areas that require them. (For example: Washington, D.C. has an indoor mask mandate currently, so we will require participants to wear masks at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and the St. John Paul II National Shrine, etc.)

Pre-pilgrimage Health Check:

1. For the benefit of all, please do not participate in the 2022 March for Life if you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms before departure.
2. We will give a full refund to anyone that needs to cancel the trip before departure due to experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.

Washington D.C. Vaccine Mandate:

1. Beginning January 15, 2022, Washington, D.C. will be requiring proof of vaccination to enter certain buildings. Museums and churches are exempt from this list. Our itinerary does not call for entering buildings that would require a vaccine per the Washington, D.C. mandate and so this will have, at most, a very limited effect on our pilgrimage participants.

For Pilgrims Who Develop COVID-19 Symptoms on the Pilgrimage:

1. We may/will ask those who develop COVID-19 symptoms to take a COVID-19 test and/or remain with appropriate adult supervision (at least 2 adults) in a "quarantine area." Given the severity of the symptoms and/or pending a positive test, we would send the pilgrim home early. Our pilgrimage organizers would organize a "carpool" back to Indiana with 2 adults driving the sick student / pilgrim back to limit exposure for other participants.
